Samboree Information:

It has been tradition for the 3 Rivers Chapter, when attending the State Samboree, to wear yellow/gold vests to distinguish us from the other Chapters of in the state. The vests become adorned with the various patches awarded at Good Sam events members have attended over time. For those who do not have a vest but would like to continue the tradition starting at the 2014 State Samboree the vests are available for \$20 each at the Good Sam online store. Here's how to get them:

- 1 Go to www.goodsamstore.com
- 2 In the search window to the left type "vest" and click on "Go"
- 3 Choose the bottom item, "Embroidered Patch Vest"
- 4 Choose Gold color, Size, and Patch design and add to cart. Repeat to order a second vest (i.e. Samantha Patch)
- 5 Proceed thru Checkout instructions.
- 6 And then wait for delivery.

 Don't wait too long to order, estimates range from 2 to 4 weeks)

Remember, the Patches to go on the back of the vests are available from Renate Ehrhard for \$5
